DATA SUBMISSION

The submission of data in the registration form is mandatory for the purposes referred to point 1 for the provision of the services you required. Failure to submit these data will result in failure to subscribe to the website and, consequently, to the impossibility to access the contents of RISE Lab and to register for free events (conferences, workshop, seminars, etc.) organized by RISE Lab.

Failure to provide the data and your consent for purposes referred to point 1, 2 and 4 is optional, therefore will have no effects on the registration to the website or events. The submission of data for the purposes referred to point 3 is mandatory only in case of participation to events at the headquarters of the University of Brescia.

DATA RECIPIENTS

The data may be processed by external parties operating as Controllers such as, by way of example, independent professionals (e.g., legal firm, accountants), supervisory and control authorities and bodies, and public or private subjects in general, entitled to request the data.

Subject to consent (optional and revocable at any time), the data may be transferred to third parties like supporters, partners of the event (partners and/or sponsors of RISE Lab events and/or research indicated on the event webpage) for communications regarding their products and services, newsletters and events, as well as to realize market studies and statistical analysis.

The data may also be processed, on behalf of the Institution, by external parties designated as supervisors that have received adequate operating instructions. These external parties are essentially included in the following categories:

- Companies offering management and maintenance services for website's information infrastructure;
- Companies offering support for the realization of market studies.

AUTHORIZED DATA PROCESSORS

Personal data may be transferred abroad, in accordance with the Regulation, even to non-European countries when it is necessary for one of the purposes indicated in this statement. The transfer to extra-EU countries, in addition to cases where this is ensured by the adequacy of the European Commission's decisions, is conducted in such a way as to provide pertinent and appropriate guarantees under Articles 46 or 47 or 49 of the Regulation.

RIGHTS OF THE INTERESTED PARTY – COMPLAINT TO THE SUPERVISORY AUTHORITIES

By contacting the email address (<u>m.ardolino@unibs.it</u>), interested parties may at any time request the Data Controller:

- to access data concerning their person, to cancel the data, to revise incorrect information, to integrate incomplete data, as well as request the limitation of processing;
- to object the processing conducted for the implementation of a task of public interest or connected to the exercise of public powers pursuant to art. 6 let. e);
- to revoke the consent given at any time, without prejudice to the legitimacy of previously conducted processing.

As regards to recorded images, in view of the intrinsic nature of the data processed as images collected in real time during an event, some rights are not actually exercisable (the right to update or integrate, the right of rectification pursuant to art.16 GDPR).

In case of objection from the interested party, the Data Controller, by considering the available technology and the implementation costs, will adopt, where technically possible, reasonable measures, including technical ones, to obscure the image of the participant who has objected for legitimate reasons or has requested the cancellation.

Interested parties are also entitled to lodge a complaint with the competent supervisory authority (Article

77 of the GDPR), as well as to refer to the appropriate judicial offices (Article 79 of the GDPR).

In addition, if the processing is based on consent or on the contract and it is carried out with automated tools, the interested parties have the right to receive the data in a structured, commonly used format that can be read by automatic devices, as well as, if technically feasible, to transmit such data to another data Controller without impediments.

Interested parties have the right to revoke the consent given at any time for purposes of scientific promotion and dissemination, as well as to oppose the processing of data for the purpose of communications on events and/or for commercial purposes, without prejudice to the previously conducted processing.
